Opening Prayer - Fr. Eugene led us in prayer

The 7:05 pm meeting was called to order by Anne Brosmer.

The minutes were approved on line.

Introductions were done by all. Maricela Angeles is our new Holy Trinity parent representative.

New Business

1. Budget – Dan Fritch presented

- a. Do not change weekly collection amount
- b. Total 2019/20 \$1,489,640.00 compared to Total 2020/21 \$1,416,701.00
- c. Received \$150,570.00 from government for PPE.
- d. Strategic plan changes have not been factored in. As the changes are identified those inputs will be reviewed.
- e. Sacristan role, once Chris leaves, will be done by a combination of volunteers.
- f. Insurance do we every look for other providers? Answer: it is diocesan, and it is a very competitive at this time. They share in the costs when rates go up drastically.
- g. What about renovation costs? Answer: A test with top 20 donors is planned to be done in the next few weeks as a litmus test to see if we can get enough to give us comfort to move ahead or whether we need to hold. This is not currently in the budget. We would have to raise 80% of the money up front before we can start the renovation.
- h. TV Mass no change in costs. Does moving it to streaming save money? We received a grant to assist with this. Otherwise streaming would cost \$1000/mo.
- i. Missalettes cost is lower due to not being able to have them in church for the next 6-8 mo to COVID. The company we use currently does not have bilingual. When we can get them the question was raised about moving to a bilingual missalette in the future.
- j. Thank you to Jane and Fr Andrew for their hard work in reducing expenses by \$72,000 in budget.
- k. Jason moved to approve the budget. Ann Rasche seconded.

2. Parish Center Opening – Fr. Eugene reported

- a. Bishop has approved parish center reopening. We must do social distancing or wear masks.
- b. Bereavement meals are restarting for immediate family. Ex: Deceased's spouse, children, grandchildren, siblings.
- c. Commissions can begin meeting.
- d. Other gatherings are case by case basis based on whether we can abide by the diocesan guidelines.
- e. Meeting host/attendees must ensure cleaning is done afterward.
- f. It was suggested to post the social distancing/mask guidelines in various locations ex: doorways

3. Parish Council Elections – Fr. Eugene reported

- a. Fr. Eugene has a suggestion that we move to a smaller parish council. The smaller the group the more intimate it can be. This can be accomplished by not holding elections as people's terms expires. The idea is to reduce from 10 to 6 at large members. At large members would still be the majority.
- b. Bridget pointed out that the parish council meetings have 17 attendees made of parish council and commission representatives. Goal is to have 6 at large members + 5 commission representatives.

4. Strategic Plan Approval – Anne held vote

a. Motion to approve was made by Van. Jason seconded. All in favor. No one opposed.

Old Business:

1. Evangelization & Outreach – Mike reported

- a. USDA distribution coordination between Redemption and St. Joseph was extremely successful.
- b. St. Ferdinand set up a distribution there. St. Celestine and Dubois are in the process of setting up their distribution.
- c. The current plan is to do distributions every 2 wks. The USDA has approved this distribution through August.
- d. The outpouring of volunteers was outstanding. They had a lot of fun and there were many smiles.
- e. Looking at having Kona ice here for distribution.
- f. People were here to do shredding
- g. Blood drive done twice in the bus in North parking lot.
- h. Next distribution is July 8. They are looking for alternative locations. Police are supportive of wherever we might do this.

2. **Renovation Report** – *Fr. Eugene reported*

- a. Discussed HU system for heating and air due to noise of the current system. They determined they should look for other options that are lower cost.
- b. Discussed Fund Raising proposal & top 20 donor conversations.
- c. Tentative presentation date to parish is 2^{nd} week in August.
- d. Next meeting for group will be in July.
